

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Victoria's Graduated Licensing System

The Graduated Licensing System makes it compulsory for learners drivers 21 years of age to obtain 120 hours of supervised driving experience prior to taking the probationary license test.

For most people, learner driver experience is gained through parents or other family members in family owned vehicles with the support of professional driving lessons.

The Victorian Government recognizes that young people may find it difficult to gain the driving experience required under the Graduated Licensing System.





While the TAC L2P Program is premised on the goal of increased road safety and removing a barrier that may prevent young people from gaining a license, it's also a community development program.

The program is reported to be the largest youth mentoring program in the state.



TAC L2P: Help for young Learner drivers

The TAC L2P – learner driver mentor program assists learners under 21 years of age, without access to a supervising driver or vehicle, to gain the 120 hours of driving experience required to apply for a probationary licence.

Young people are matched with fully licensed volunteer mentors, and use a sponsored vehicle to gain supervised driving experience.

Learner Drivers

To join a TAC L2P program, you need to be:

- Between 16 and 21 years of age
- A current learner's permit holder without access to either a vehicle, a supervising driver, or both

Learner drivers can refer themselves to one of 59 TAC L2P programs across Victoria or be referred by parents, schools, community agencies or other organisations.
